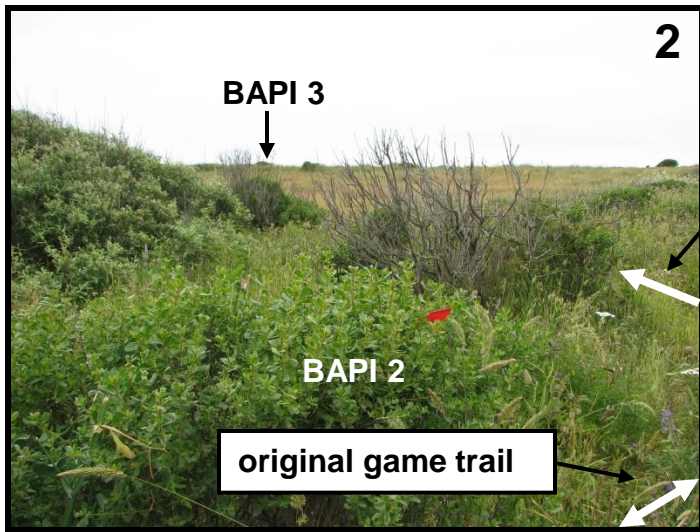
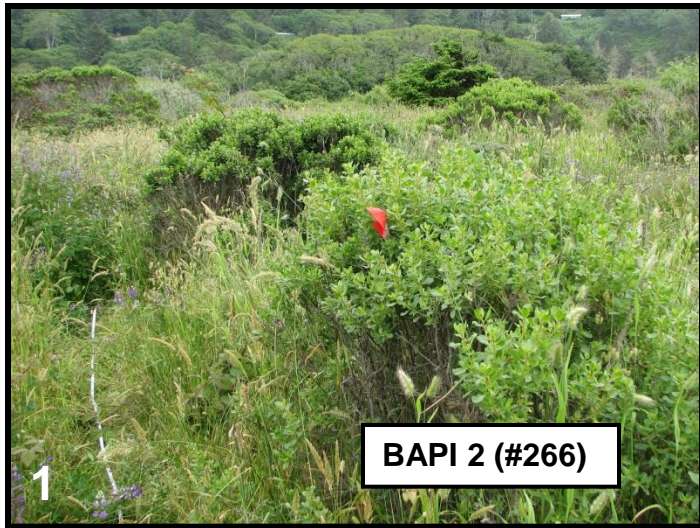


CPP - REDW - KVC5 - BAPI 1

Coyote Brush (*Baccharis pilularis*)

From the north side of the KVC parking lot, take the boardwalk to the Redwood Creek estuary. You will see a game trail on the left prior to reaching the estuary lookout. BAPI 1 (female) will be the first large shrub on the left side (sea-side) of the game trail.



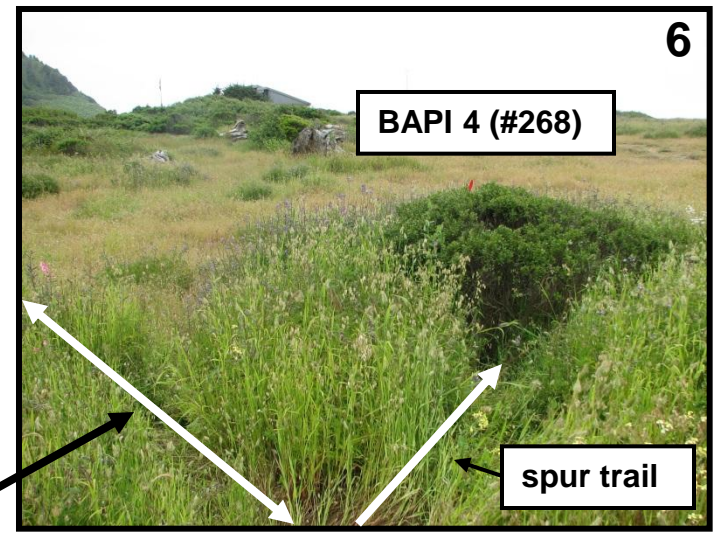
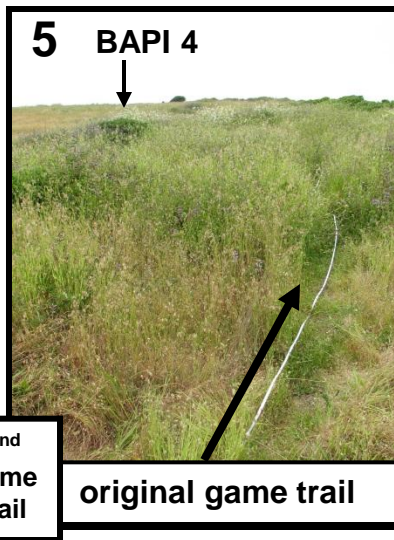
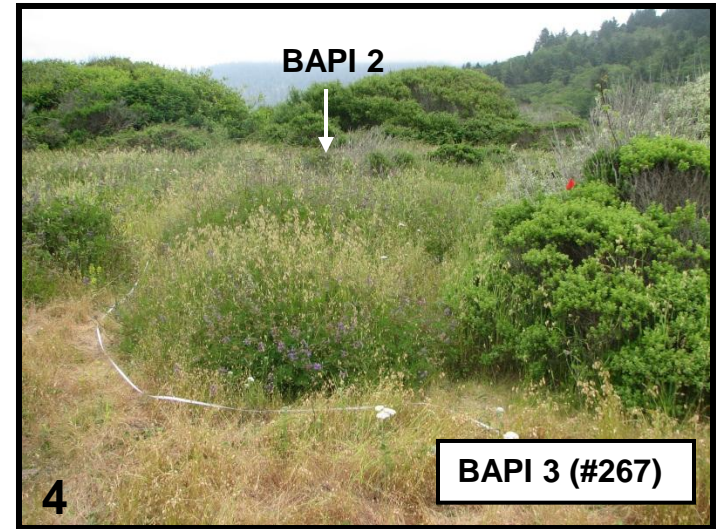
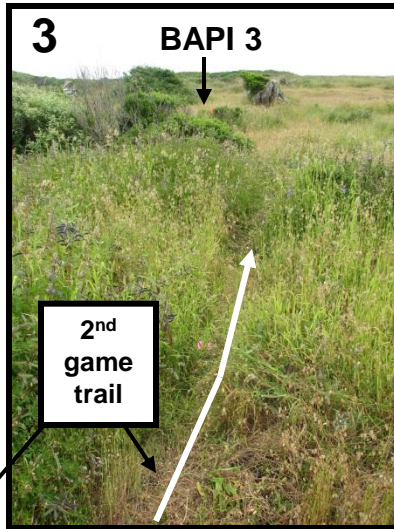


5. Return to the original game trail. This photo shows BAPI 4 (female) as seen from the intersection of the two trails.

6. BAPI 4 is also arrived by a short spur trail off of the original game trail; this view shows the Kuchel Visitor Center.

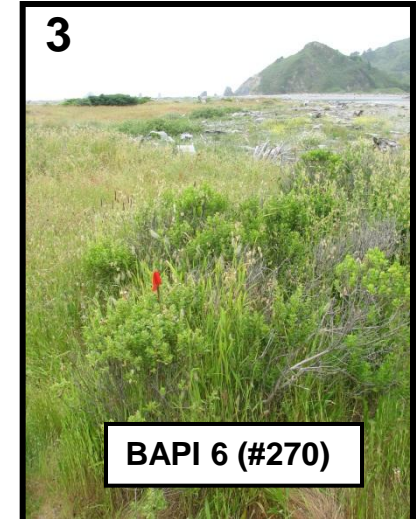
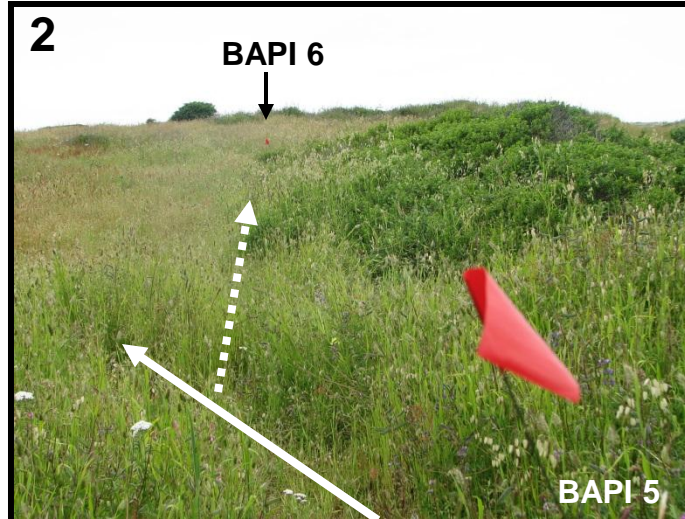
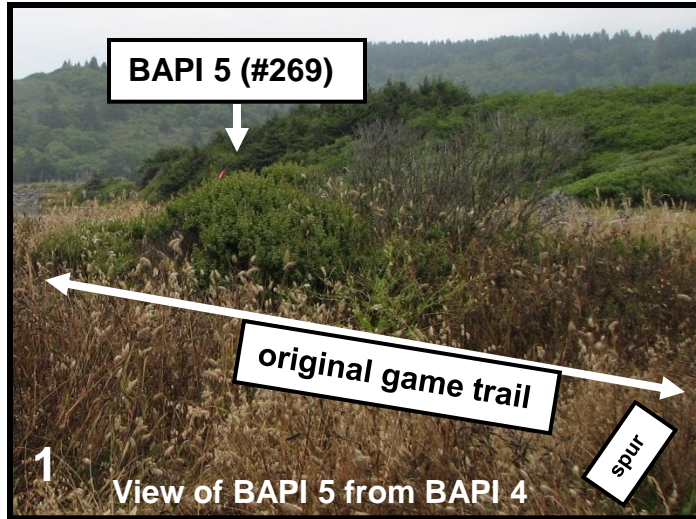
CPP - REDW - KVC5 - BAPI (2-4) Coyote Brush (*Baccharis pilularis*)

- 1.** Continue on game trail, skip a medium sized coyote brush on left side (sea-side) of trail, approach the next on the left – this is BAPI 2 (male).
- 2.** Looking towards the ocean from BAPI 2 one can see BAPI 3 (female).
- 3.** Just past BAPI 2 there is another game trail that leads to BAPI 3.
- 4.** This is the opposite view of picture #3.

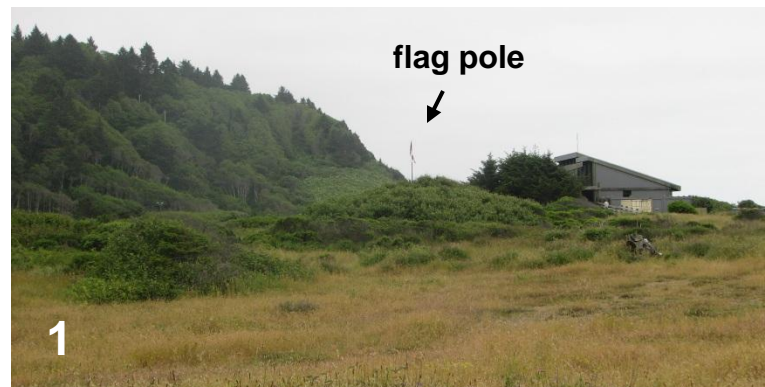


CPP - REDW - KVC5 - BAPI (5-7) Coyote Brush (*Baccharis pilularis*)

1. Continue on original game trail from intersection to BAPI 4. The first large shrub on right (estuary side) is BAPI 5 (male).
2. Looking from BAPI 5 continue on, then veer right from trail along a stretch of coyote brush on right. BAPI 6 (female) is one of the last smaller shrubs ending the stretch.
3. View of BAPI 6 on approach.



CPP - REDW - KVC5 - BAPI (8-9) Coyote Brush (*Baccharis pilularis*)



1. While at BAPI 6, turn around and face visitor center flag pole, then pan left to photo 2.
2. Walk towards center drift log. BAPI 9 (#302) (female) is adjacent to this log.
3. BAPI 8 (#301) (male) is to the left of BAPI 9 in this view, but it is actually behind the shrub visible in the picture.
